A motion to accept the minutes of the July 7, 2021 meeting and the June 28, 2021 special called meeting was made by Commissioner Rhoads and seconded by Commissioner Wingard. Motion carried. Retiring Commissioner Ron Brown was recognized for his service and time served on the Commission with a commemorative plaque.

Item I: Item one was a request from the Prescott School District to establish a police department for its school district. Commissioner Holladay made a motion to grant the request and was seconded by Commissioner Marsh. Motion carried.

Item II: Item two was postponed until the November meeting.

Item III: Item three was a request from the Mt. Pine School District to establish a police department for its school district. Commissioner Phillips made a motion to grant the request and was seconded by Commissioner Marsh. Motion carried.

Item IV: Item four was a request from the Prescott Police Department to withdraw its request for decertification of former officer Justin Babbitt. Commissioner Holladay made a motion to deny the request and was seconded by Commissioner Phillips. Motion carried.

Item V: Item five was a request for an extension of time for Dallas County Deputy Jordan Ables. Commissioner Woods made a motion to grant the request and was seconded by Commissioner Rhoads. Motion carried.

Item VI: Item six was a request from the Jericho Police Department for a waiver to employ additional part-time officers. Commissioner Holladay made a motion to grant the waiver for one year to allow Jericho Police Department time to come into compliance with Act 218 of 2021. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Golden. Motion carried.

Item VII: Item seven was a request from Terry Payne to be recertified as a law enforcement officer under CLEST Rule 1034. Commissioner Holladay made a motion to deny the request and was seconded by Commissioner Golden. Motion carried.

Item VIII: Item eight was a request from Tanner Hazelton to be recertified as a law enforcement officer under CLEST Rule 1034. Commissioner Holladay made a motion to grant the request and was seconded by Commissioner Marsh. Motion carried.

Item XIX: Item nineteen was a request from the Conway Police Department for the decertification of former Officer Austin Claggett. A motion to proceed to a decertification hearing was made by Commissioner Holladay and seconded by Commissioner Phillips. Motion Carried.

Item XXII: Item twenty-two was a request from the ASU Police Department for the decertification of former Officer Kalvin Booker. A motion to proceed to a decertification hearing was made by Commissioner Phillips and seconded by Commissioner Marsh. Motion carried.

Item XXIII: Item twenty-three was a request from the Hot Springs Police Department for the decertification of former Officer John T. McLean. A motion to proceed to a decertification hearing was made by Commissioner Rhoads and seconded by Commissioner Phillips. Motion carried.

Following the regular business meeting, signed Consent Agreements by **Rhett Ballard and Jason Wolfenbarger** were presented to the Commission for a final vote on decertification. A motion was made by Commissioner Phillips to accept the consent agreements and decertify both individuals. Commissioner Reynolds seconded. Motion carried.

Five (5) Uncontested Hearings for **James White, John Alberson, Lannie Reaves, Corey McCullough, and Dakota Dunkin** were conducted. Commissioner Rhoads made a motion that the Findings of Facts and Conclusions of Law had been met. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Golden. Motion Carried. A contested hearing was conducted for **Seneca Thornton**. After hearing all evidence presented, a motion was made by Commissioner Rhoads that the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law had been met but to not decertify. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Golden. Motion carried by a majority vote. The hearings were presided over by Hearing Officer Jim Brader and recorded by Court Reporter Trish Hendrix. A total of seven (7) officers were decertified by the Commission.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Cook reported that she and Deputy Director Fred Weatherspoon attended a press conference announcing an award of \$500,000 by the Attorney General's Office to the DPS Equipment Grant Fund. She reported that CLEST staff is finalizing the report on the CLEST strategic plan and that Duty to Intervene training has been completed and is now available online. She reported that the Telephone-CPR training program has been launched and is now available on the DPS website. She reported that DPS received CARES Funding to upgrade the Commission Room in Little Rock.
